Conclusions [#sec:conclusion](#) ===== Achieving high speed of convergence is of great interest when designing algorithms for complex problems, especially when the iterative process is time consuming. In this paper, we demonstrated that the MALM could perform a level-set method at a very high rate of convergence. We considered a gradient-based level-set method and presented a convergent algorithm. Our results are supported by numerical evidence. Theoretical results show that for a given number of iterations, the MALM will converge to the true solution at a rate of  $1/(n\lambda_0)$  for  $\lambda_0$  small enough and  $n$  large enough. The parameter  $n$  is, in turn, related to the number of points  $y_i$  on the level-set  $c(x)$ . This suggests that the most important aspect of this work is to decide when to stop the iterations, i.e., when  $n$  is large enough. Unfortunately, at this stage of the development of the MALM, a rigorous bound for the stopping time cannot be given. In this paper we focused on the estimation of the level-set boundary in one dimension. However, the MALM can easily be generalized to higher dimension.
